The 8th Annual Rikkyo University Japanese Speech Contest for International Students Sponsored by the Tokyo Saint Paul Lions Club Requirements

1. PURPOSE:

The Center for Japanese Language Education (CJLE) will host its 8th annual Japanese Speech Contest. This contest aims to provide opportunities for Special International Students (Short-term exchange students studying at Rikkyo) and regular International students to show their achievements and experiences in Japan and hopefully to motivate them to improve their proficiency in Japanese. Also, the contest will provide opportunities to enhance mutual understanding (or cultural exchange) between international students and people around international students including Japanese students at Rikkyo.

2. DATE:

June 22nd, 2019 (Saturday) 1:00pm-5:00pm

3. VENUE:

5. ELIGIBILITY:

Applicants must be a special international student or a regular undergraduate student at Rikkyo University, or a graduate student who has been enrolled in a Japanese language course offered by the CJLE.

7. NUMBER FOR CONTESTANTS:

Fifteen to twenty

*In the event of too many applicants, screening will be done by evaluating the summary on the application form.

8. SPEECH THEME:

Theme is open.

*Propaganda is not allowed.

9. SPEECH DURATION:

Within 3 minutes for beginners

Within 5 minutes for intermediate and advanced

- * Any speech exceeding the fixed duration will be penalized.
- * After giving an introduction, the contestants must immediately proceed to the podium. The duration of the speech starts to be measured when the contestant starts to speak.

10. USING AUDIO-VISUAL EQUIPMENT/ USING A SCRIPT:

During the speech, using audio-visual equipment and using a script are not allowed.

*Refer to the CJLE Office in advance about using national costumes or props.

Announcements will be sent to all applicants individually by e-mail regardless of acceptance. It will be sent to e-mail address on the application by April 29th (Monday).

*Please be sure to send an e-mail to confirm acceptance immediately.

13. JUDGES:

Director and Deputy Director of the CJLE, Members of the CJLE, Director of the International Office, Members of the Tokyo Saint Paul Lions Club

14. JUDGING CRITERIA:

- 1) In the event of too many applicants, screening will be done by evaluating the summary on the application form.
- 2) Evaluated by overall Japanese proficiency, content and presentation. Audience votes are added for the Audience Special Prize.
 - * All decisions of the judges are final.

15. AUDIENCE:

Students and staff of Rikkyo University. Also open to the public (free, application not required)

16. PREPARATIONS FOR THE SPEECH:

- 1) Japanese student advisors
 - Each participant will be matched with one Japanese student advisor to practice the speech with.
 - If the applicant has someone in mind, fill in the student's information (student ID, name, phone number, e-mail address) with his/her consent.
 - * <u>Japanese student Advisor must attend the speech contest on</u> <u>June 22nd.</u>
 - * Japanese Student advisors must be a Rikkyo University undergraduate/graduate student.
 - When the contestant doesn't have anyone in mind, the CJLE Office will match the contestant with a Japanese student advisor.
- 2) Using the Japanese Language Support Desk

Script should be checked at least once at the Japanese Language Support Desk during the period below.

April 29th (Monday) - May 29th (Wednesday)

- *Contestants may use the Japanese Language Support Desk more than once during or outside of the period above.
