Application Guidelines for Participants

➤ **Contest Overview**

●PURPOSE
The Center for Japanese Language Education (CJLE) will host its 15 th annual Japanese Speech Contest. This contest aims to provide opportunities for Special International Students (non-degree students including exchange students studying at Rikkyo) and regular international students to show their achievements and experiences in Japan and hopefully to motivate them to improve their proficiency in Japanese. Also, the contest will provide opportunities to enhance mutual understanding (or cultural exchange) as well as improving Japanese skills, as international students will work in pair with student advisors from among Rikkyo students to prepare for their speeches.

➤ **Application Guidelines**

ELIGIBILITY	1. Applicants must be a special international student or a regular undergraduate/graduate student at Rikkyo University, who has been enrolled in a Japanese language course offered by the CJLE during AY2026. 2. Applicants must understand the purpose described in “PURPOSE” above, prepare and practice their speeches appropriately, and be able to work hard on their speeches.
NUMBER FOR CONTESTANTS	Approximately 15 *In the event of too many applicants, screening will be done by evaluating the summary on the application form.
CATEGORIES	Beginner (J0–J3) / Intermediate (J4–J6) / Advanced (J7 · J8)
SPEECH THEME	Theme is open. *Propaganda is not allowed.
SPEECH DURATION	Within 3 minutes for beginners Within 5 minutes for intermediate and advanced
USING AUDIO-VISUAL EQUIPMENT/ USING A SCRIPT	During the speech, using audio-visual equipment and script are not allowed. *Consult the CJLE Office in advance about using national costumes or props.

JUDGING CRITERIA	Evaluated by overall Japanese proficiency, content and presentation. Audience Votes are added for the Audience Special Prize.
AWARDS&PRIZES	Multiple awards will be presented. Winners will receive a certificate and a supplementary prize (QUO card).
SPEECH ADVISOR	Each participant will be assigned one each student speech advisor, a student from Rikkyo University who volunteered to support international students with their speeches. Please work together with your speech advisor to prepare for the contest. The CJLE will handle the matching process between participants and speech advisors. If you already have a student from Rikkyo who has agreed to serve as your speech advisor, please obtain their prior consent and enter their name, affiliation, and other required details in the application form below. *Student speech advisors must attend the speech contest. *Student speech advisors must be a Rikkyo University undergraduate / graduate student.

NOTES	*Only unpublished speech is accepted. *J0–J3 students may fill in the “summary” in English when applying. (The speech must be made in Japanese.)

October 12 (Mon.) <Announcement of Participants>	Announcements will be sent to all the applicants individually by e-mail regardless of acceptance. It will be sent to the e-mail address on your application. The speech advisor will contact the participant by email later, so please check your email and contact each other.
From October 16 (Fri.) to October 22 (Thu.) <Review of the Speech Script with a Speech Advisor>	Prepare your speech script based on the abstract submitted at the time of application. Then, please have your speech script reviewed by your speech advisor to get their feedback.
From October 23 (Fri.) to October 30 (Fri.)	Your script, which has been reviewed by your speech advisor, should be checked by the CJLE instructors at least once at the Japanese Language Support Desk during the period on the left.
